



ANNEX TO MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

THE FACULTY OF SOCIAL ADMINISTRATION, THAMMASAT UNIVERSITY

AND

SCHOOL FOR BUSINESS AND SOCIETY, UNIVERSITY OF YORK

Recognising successful ongoing discussions and collaborations between The Faculty of Social Administration, Thammasat University, Thailand and the School for Business and Society, University of York, the United Kingdom (hereafter referred to as "The Parties") who signed an MOU on 24th October 2022.

This Annex to the existing MOU of 2022 has been devised in recognition of The Parties' interest in exploring the opportunities that benefit students and academics and support the framework for a mutually beneficial international collaboration. This Annex reflects the shared missions of The Parties to deliver high-quality teaching and learning and to provide students with a true global perspective and the passport to success that an international experience affords.

INTENDED AREAS OF COOPERATION

The Parties agree to engage in enthusiastic discussions to identify mutually beneficial collaborative provision initiatives. The Parties will collaborate to co-determine details of the initiatives, defining key aspects such as, but not limited to, the models for teaching collaboration, the level of provision, and the curriculum. The Parties will work together to share details of regulatory and policy considerations at their respective institutions and at the national level. The terms and conditions of each programme shall be agreed in writing before they commence and will be subject to a separate agreement.

The Parties will set out to explore teaching collaboration:

- 1. at the undergraduate level.
 - 2. at the Masters level.
